 - a. What are some reasons why your plans would not glorify God?
 - b. How can you ensure as much as possible that your plans glorify God?
- 3. Read Ephesians 2:10. Why should this verse cause you to pause and recognize that God does in fact have plans for your everyday life?
- 4. Read Luke 12:16-21 and Proverbs 27:1. Why is planning your life without depending on God arrogant, especially if you are a Christian?
 - a. How does your planning often lead to a self-serving schedule that may not honor God?
 - b. What would a daily or weekly schedule look like that honors God and His Bride (the Church)?
