  - a. What do the contrasts between you and Jesus do to help you recognize Jesus as the perfect substitute for your depravity?
- 4. Read <u>Matthew 4:17</u>. What is the fundamental message of Jesus' preaching at the beginning of His ministry in Matthew 4?
