PREACHING POINT: Embrace your assignment as Christ's ambassador by living a reconciled life and calling others to be reconciled to God through the Gospel.

1. Refuse _____ (v.17)

2 Corinthians 5:17-21 (ESV)
17 Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come. 18 All this is from God, who through Christ reconciled us to himself and gave us the ministry of reconciliation; 19 that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation. 20 Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, God making his appeal through us. We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. 21 For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

1. What is one observation or application you found helpful from Sunday's sermon?

2. Read Colossians 3:1-17 & Ephesians 4:22-32. As someone who has been made new in Christ, what are the sins you are needing to put off and what Christlike attitudes and actions are you needing to put on? How do these passages help you know what to expect when you're helping someone else live a new life for Christ?
 - a. Read Philippians 1:6. How does this promise give you hope as you live your new life in Christ, and give you hope as you help others in their new life?

3. Read Romans 5:6–11 & Colossians 1:20–22. How does God's loving decision to reconcile you—while you were His enemy—shape the way you plan your day, interact with people, and how you view your family?

4. Read Matthew 28:18–20, Luke 24:46–47, & 2 Corinthians 5:18-19. How do these passages remind you that God saved you not only to reconcile you to Himself, but also to use you to help others be reconciled to Him?
 - a. What practical reminders or habits could help you keep this mission at the center of your life?

5. Read Ephesians 6:19-20, Philippians 1:12–14, & Acts 17:16–17. How does Paul's example of being Christ's ambassador wherever he went motivate you to be Christ's ambassador wherever you go?
 - a. Where in your life (home, job, etc.) do you need to be a better ambassador of Christ?

6. Read Matthew 9:35–38, Romans 9:1–3, & 2 Corinthians 5:20. How does the compassion of Jesus and the burden of Paul help you call people to be reconciled to God?
 - a. Who is one person God may be prompting you to reach out to so they can hear the gospel and be reconciled to God?
