- 1. What is one observation or application you found helpful from this week's sermon?
- 2. Read <u>Isaiah 53:4–6</u> and <u>Ephesians 2:13-18</u>. How does recounting the tremendous personal cost Jesus went through on your behalf to make peace between you and God help you define the personal cost of being a peacemaker?
 - a. Read <u>Daniel 7:13-14</u>, <u>Hebrews 12:1–2</u> and <u>Revelation 5:9–13</u>. Compare the cost that Jesus went through to make peace between God and man with the reward that Jesus receives at the resurrection of the saints.
 - **b.** How does the Joy set before Christ and His perseverance motivate you to bear the pain associated with peacemaking knowing that there is great reward awaiting faithful ambassadors of Christ?
- 3. What sacrifices are often necessary to be an effective peacemaker? Why did you choose your answer?
- 4. Read <u>1 Corinthians 10:31–11:1</u>. What does this verse teach you about how the Bible prioritizes peace with God through Christ and peace with others over an individual's comforts and personal preferences?
 - a. What personal preferences and comforts do you often prioritize over peacemaking?
