1. Read Jeremiah 51:11 & Proverbs 21:1. Although the kingdoms of the world look autonomous how do these verses as well as the scene in Daniel 7 paint a different picture of what is really going on? What are the implications of this picture in your life?

2. Read Psalm 46. Compare and contrast the scenes in Daniel 7:1-11 and Psalm 46. What is distinct about being in God's presence Vs. being in the world, according to these verses? How do these verses parallel to your life even now when you are living according to God's will Vs. when you aren't?

3. Read Matthew 13:18–23. When the fourth Beast in Daniel 7 began speaking Daniel looked away from the majestic God and started listening to what the beast was saying. Often when the kingdoms of this world began talking and babbling, we become distracted from God's plan and start focusing on the kingdoms of this world. Why does the Bible spend so much time teaching us about the dangers of being distracted from God? How do you often become distracted from God's plan? What are some solutions for keeping your focus on God, amidst the chaos?

4. Read 2 Peter 3:9–15. Forgetting about the imminent coming of Christ can be easy in our day due to the babbling of the kingdoms around us and our own inability to focus on God. But the Bible leaves no room to forget that Christ will come and rule the universe! What should your life look like in regard to living today in light of the coming of Christ, according to this passage?
