2. Read Ephesians 1:11–14 & Romans 8:28–30. Now having a better understanding of your captivity to sin recount from these verses the marvelous treasure of God's gift in Christ.
3. Read Titus 2:11–14 & Ezekiel 37:23. What are the temporal benefits of your freedom from sin? What are the eternal benefits of your freedom from sin?
4. Read Galatians 5:22-23 & Ephesians 4:1–6. Many Christians neglect the new role their position in God's kingdom requires. Why is bearing the fruits of righteousness in the here and now important for any person who claims to be free from the bondage of sin?
